Early Childhood Intervention

1745 Children Served Significant progress in:

- 94% using appropriate behaviors to meet needs.
- 93% acquiring knowledge and skills.
- 86% having positive social/emotional skills.



Therapy Services for Children 3-5 Years Old

87 children served

2500 therapy hours provided

Therapy goals are reviewed on an ongoing basis and changed based on need. Children are re-assessed every 6 months.



Family Education and Support

660 parents and caregivers served % of parents reported:

- 99% saw increased emotional strength.
- 95% feel like they can better meet the needs of themselves and their families.
- 93% feel that workshops help them gain confidence in supporting their child with special needs.


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
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FY 2016 - Sources of Revenue
